

Thy Kingdom Come is a worldwide prayer movement that invites Christians around the world to pray from Ascension to Pentecost.

Since its launch by the Archbishops of Canterbury and York in 2016, Christians from 172 countries and 65 denominations have taken part in praying for friends and family to come to faith in Jesus Christ. These days have always been full of expectation and anticipation. As the Lord Jesus ascended, He promised the gift of the Holy Spirit to enable the disciples to be witnesses. As they waited for the promise to be fulfilled they devoted themselves constantly to prayer (Acts 1:14).

So, the renewed call across the church is to set these days apart to pray, for the world for our nation, our family and friends. We especially ask you to consider praying for 5 people to come to know more about the love and peace of Jesus Christ. You can write their names down and commit yourself to hold them in your daily prayers at this time.

I received letter this week from our friend Betty whom I got to visit on her birthday last week. Betty writes:



Ascension Reading adapted from Luke 24 and Acts 1

Jesus said to them, "These are my words that I spoke to you while I was
still with you--that everything written about me in the law of Moses,
the prophets, and the psalms must be fulfilled."

Then he opened their minds to understand the scriptures, and he said
to them, "Thus it is written, that the Messiah is to suffer, and to rise
from the dead on the third day, and that repentance and forgiveness of
sins is to be proclaimed in his name to all nations, beginning from
Jerusalem. You are witnesses of these things. And I am sending upon
you what my Father promised; so stay here in the city until you have
been clothed with power from on high."

Acts ...you will receive power from on high when the Holy Spirit has
come upon you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, in all Judea
and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth." When he had said this, as
the disciples were watching, he was lifted up, and a cloud took him out
of their sight.

While he was going and they were gazing up toward heaven, suddenly two men in white robes stood by them. They said, "Men of Galilee, why do you stand looking up toward heaven? This Jesus, who has been taken up from you into heaven, will come in the same way as you saw him go into heaven."

This is my Blood of the new covenant;
it is poured out for you,
and for all, that sins may be forgiven.
Do this in remembrance of me.'

**We now obey your Son's command.
We recall his blessed passion and death,
his glorious resurrection and ascension;
and we look for the coming of his Kingdom.
Made one with him, we offer you these gifts
and with them ourselves, a single, holy, living sacrifice.**

Hear us, most merciful Father,
and send your Holy Spirit upon us
