



A Rector's Musings

The Building is closed
The Church is Open



We are all aware that for the last 14 weeks the church buildings have been closed. However, I do hope that many of us have come to realise and experience afresh the truth that the church is not a building but the people.

We have seen this truth in action with our Pastoral Phone calls keeping contact with all church members. Our Facebook Page and group continues to be a place for interaction during the week and our on-line worship has offered us opportunities to meet together as the people of St Leonard's and St Mary's. Plus this our Connect Newsletter keeps us connected and up to date with news from the church although I know from feedback received that most people prefer reading about Izzy and doing the word-search.

My thanks go to all who have been active over this time calling people and touching base with members young and old. Thanks too to the Clergy Team for embracing a move to online worship. While we have been trying to flatten the Coronavirus curve it has also been a steep learning curve as we adapted our services to Zoom and Facebook live along with links to YouTube. On reflection as far as I can see we have managed to reach out to the vast majority of church members and I know that many of you have appreciated the work that has been done.

On-line worship does have its advantages especially if you are tuning in later you can watch the video and fast forward the sermon. You can sneak in late and no one notices especially if you are on Facebook you can be present but not seen which suits some people. While others join in on Zoom and enjoy the interaction of meeting and developing relationships across both churches. But sadly it is difficult for us to keep a track of who is joining in or not. Pastorally this disturbs me as previously people would make me aware if someone hadn't been seen for a week or two. The Pastoral group or myself could then follow this up and touch base to make sure individuals were ok. So although we have a good number tuning in I feel slight

disconnected from the church family but do hope to see more and more people as we and they become more familiar with the technology.

Nevertheless, I know many of us are also longing to get back to meeting up and worshipping together.

To have the opportunity face to face to catch up, share the peace, receive communion, have a hug and a chat over coffee and cake.

Although we are now entering what is known as Phase 2 of the Scottish Governments Road Map which slowly releases us from Lockdown we do still need to be patient at this difficult time and obey the social distancing rules and shielding guidelines where these apply.

As part of Phase 2 Churches which have a tradition of opening for Private Prayer are being allowed to do so. This is a tiny step towards the day when public worship in the church building will be once more allowed so don't all rush to the door of your local church just yet. The Vestry of each of our churches are now in the process of reading through guideline documents to help us consider how best to begin opening up the church buildings once more. There is much to consider as it is not just a simple matter of opening the doors and letting the people in. We will need to look at health and safety procedures that will need to be put in place. We have been advised to remove hymn books and bibles to minimise what can be touched to stop any potential transference. Social distancing will need to also be enforced, pews sectioned off, with only one or two to a pew and even possible a one way system for walking round the church. Along with this we will need to think about equipment like Hand gel dispensers, or cleaning products for more regular cleaning of the building. So we will be taking our time and not rushing into flinging wide the doors even though that is what I want to do. I am also aware that Phase 2 may ease things for some but for many of our congregation and especially those who are shielding our buildings are out of bounds at the moment. So we look forward in preparation to the day when we can ALL gather together but it may still be a few months off.



Molly, Rosie and Teddy are all mad Doodles. While Lochie is Jacqui's daughters Poodle and is nearly the same size as a Shetland pony.




All of us are looking forward to meeting up with friends and family again and I am sure we can all have a big party soon.

Likewise if you have any request please do get in touch and we can add these to the list and please do keep us updated.


Pastoral Calls
