On Friday 24th July, Peter, Fiona and I have been invited to take part in a Zoom Cursillo meeting. It is my turn to do a talk on something that has happened in the last six weeks and therefore **Eco Congregation** is my topic.

Reading through my notes in preparation I felt I had to clarify something that I initially hadn't done. 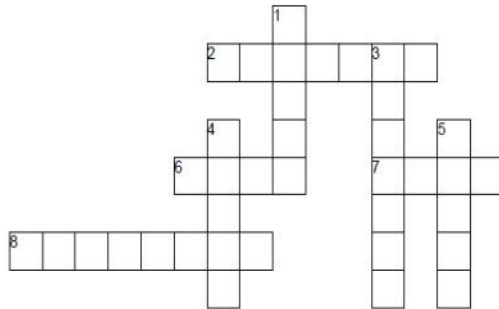
