

RE-OPENINIG PLANS

As we finalise our Risk Assessments and submit our application to reopen the churches we ask you pray. To pray for God's blessing and wisdom to know what's best to do. To pray for those who are eager to come that they will not be disappointed and that those who choose not to return at this time will still know the presence of God where they are and when they join with us on Zoom.

We also ask you to familiarise yourself with the dates and guidelines that are being introduced to allow us to safely and cautiously return to offering Sunday worship within the charge of St Leonard's and St Mary's.

We are working towards reopening on Sunday 4th October

As well as working towards this proposed return date we are keeping an eye on the weekly COVID19 reports. As long as the infection rate does not rise to much in our area we will be good to go. If not then sadly we may have to delay opening. Likewise you will appreciate that once we open if things deteriorate we may have to close if any local or national lockdowns are imposed.

Answer Yes: Please follow these steps:



STEP 1: Register in advance

Each week we will ask you to contact the Church Office by Saturday 10am and register your intention to be in church on the following Sunday.

We have a limited number that we can accommodate and do not want to turn anyone away but sadly may have to.

STEP 2: Prepare for Sunday Worship

Please do pray for all those involved in the opening of the church and those responsible for leading worship. Pray for yourself and the congregation who will gather and for those who will join us on-line. Pray that God would touch and encourage us as we gather. Pray to asking that all the technical things may run smoothly.

STEP 3: Arriving at Church

The service will begin at 10am.

Please bring your face mask and arrive early enough to be welcomed and guided to your seat. You may need to que and wait to enter. We ask you to do so remembering to keep a 2m Social Distance. Before entering please put on your mask and sanitise your hands with the sanitisers provided. A number of spare masks will be available but we encourage you to bring your own. Remember to refrain from any physical contact, a little wave or





A guide to our worship as we return.

If you can make it to church in person you will find that there will be many familiar things but also that a number of changes will be implemented during this current phase 3. This guide will hopefully help prepare you.



Once you or your family group have arrived at church. Please put on your mask and sanitise your hands. You will then be guided to a seating area. Filling the church from the front pews back towards the main door. Please stay in this area until requested to move forward for communion.



Although we plan to still have a selection of Hymns and Songs played during the service we ask those in church to refrain from singing.

(I believe it may be ok to be a bee and hum together or sing quietly to yourself behind your mask.)



We ask you too to refrain from any physical greetings at this time. We will however, share the Peace as part of our Liturgical worship but will not move from our seating area. Nevertheless a wave or gesture of peace can be given to those around you.



When receiving communion you will be invited to come forward to the Chancel Steps one pew at a time. Please sanitise your hands before receiving the bread, then lift your mask to consume the bread. After replacing your mask please sanitise your hands again before returning to your pew. The Priest on duty will also be following pastoral guidelines for this time governing the distribution.



At the end of the service we invite you to take the Pew Sheet away with you. People will be invited to exit the church from the back pew working forward. On exit please sanitise your hands and exit in an orderly fashion. Sadly there will be no refreshments served or time for fellowship or prolonged conversations.




We will also be announcing the date of our next Eco film night very soon. You get to watch the film at your own leisure and then later join in with others on a Zoom discussion about the topic covered.

A Reading from Matthew 20:1-16 Sandiann

Hear the Gospel of our Lord according to Matthew Glory to Christ our Saviour

"The kingdom of heaven is like a landowner who went out early in the morning to hire workers for his vineyard. He agreed to pay them a denarius for the day and sent them into his vineyard.

"About nine in the morning he went out and saw others standing in the marketplace doing nothing. He told them, 'You also go and work in my vineyard, and I will pay you whatever is right.' So they went.

"He went out again about noon and about three in the afternoon and did the same thing. About five in the afternoon he went out and found still others standing around. He asked them, "Why have you been standing here all day long doing nothing?" "Because no one has hired us," they answered. "He said to them, "You also go and work in my vineyard."

"When evening came, the owner of the vineyard said to his foreman, 'Call the workers and pay them their wages, beginning with the last ones hired and going on to the first.'

"The workers who were hired about five in the afternoon came and each received a denarius. So when those came who were hired first, they expected to receive more. But each one of them also received a denarius. When they received it, they began to grumble against the landowner. 'These who were hired last worked only one hour,' they said, 'and you have made them equal to us who have borne the burden of the work and the heat of the day.'

"But he answered one of them, 'I am not being unfair to you, friend. Didn't you agree to work for a denarius? Take your pay and go. I want to give the one who was hired last the same as I gave you. Don't I have the right to do what I want with my own money? Or are you envious because I am generous?'

"So the last will be first, and the first will be last."
