Happy New Year! Well that is my hope and prayer for this new year for you, your family and friends and for the church family. I pray with thanksgiving for the production and administration of the new vaccines that in time we will all be in a much safer and happier place.

Once again I acknowledge the struggle and frustration of this past year and those affecting us at the beginning of 2021. A new strain of COVID and new restrictions being enforced it can so easily feel like this hope of a happier year is already fading away. However, I need to remind all of us that as people of faith our eternal hope is not placed in any vaccine or scientist but in our Lord.

St Peter writing in his first letter (aptly named 1st Peter) encourages us and reminds us to Praise God, to give thanks for the gift of Jesus. Why? Because through the mercy and love of God gifting us Jesus we can all be born a new into a living hope. Not a dead hope or fading hope, not a wish filled hope but a sure and certain hope that is living because Jesus who died, is now the living resurrected Lord. His promise to us is that as we accept and confess him as our Lord he will forgive you and give you the gift of an eternal hope, a concrete promise of the resurrection to come.

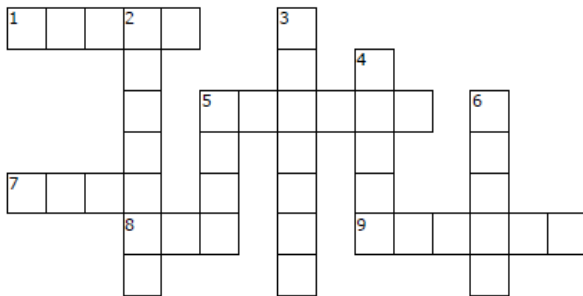
This Sunday as we celebrate the Baptism of our Lord we remember again that Jesus comes to be baptised, not because he has to but he does so to identify with us and to reveal the heart of the Father to us. As Jesus is baptised the Father cries out this is my child whom I love. This in one sense is a personal message of affirmation for Jesus as he begins his ministry of love that will lead him to the cross. It is also a reminder to us that as we confess the Lord and renew our Baptism promises that the Father looks down on us with that same love. The Good News we talk about at its very heart is the announcement that we are loved by God so much that he comes to us in Christ Jesus. Through Jesus we are given new life, a new beginning, a new hope for this life and the life to come whatever may happen in 2021. However I do still pray that it will be a happier year for one and all.
