

For a time she worked as Nurse in Roslin and later became a Hospital Chaplin working for the local Catholic Diocese. Ask the question are you growing as a disciple, learning more about Jesus and putting your faith into action. The Licensing

Bishop:

The Church is the People of God,
the Body of Christ and the dwelling of the Holy Spirit.
It is built upon the foundation of the apostles and prophets,
Jesus Christ himself being the chief cornerstone.
In baptism every disciple is called to ministry
according to the gifts of the Spirit.

Some by ordination are given particular tasks,
sharing the ministry of their Bishop.

They serve and sustain the community of the faithful through the ministry of word and sacrament and show an example of obedience to the way of Christ in works of love.

This is the work for which Jacqui has been chosen. In the name of God and on behalf of this congregation, I call you, Jacqui, to serve as Assistant Priest within these congregations. Do you accept this call?



Lent Study - Living His Story

How can we convey the love of God to our neighbours in a post-Christian world that has largely forgotten the gospel of Jesus Christ? Living His Story, is a devotional book that explores evangelism as a way of sharing God's love with people. Set out in six sessions to take you through Lent, each chapter of the 2021 Archbishop of Canterbury's Lent book can be used as a single study for individuals or small groups to use as we prepare for our Easter Celebrations.
