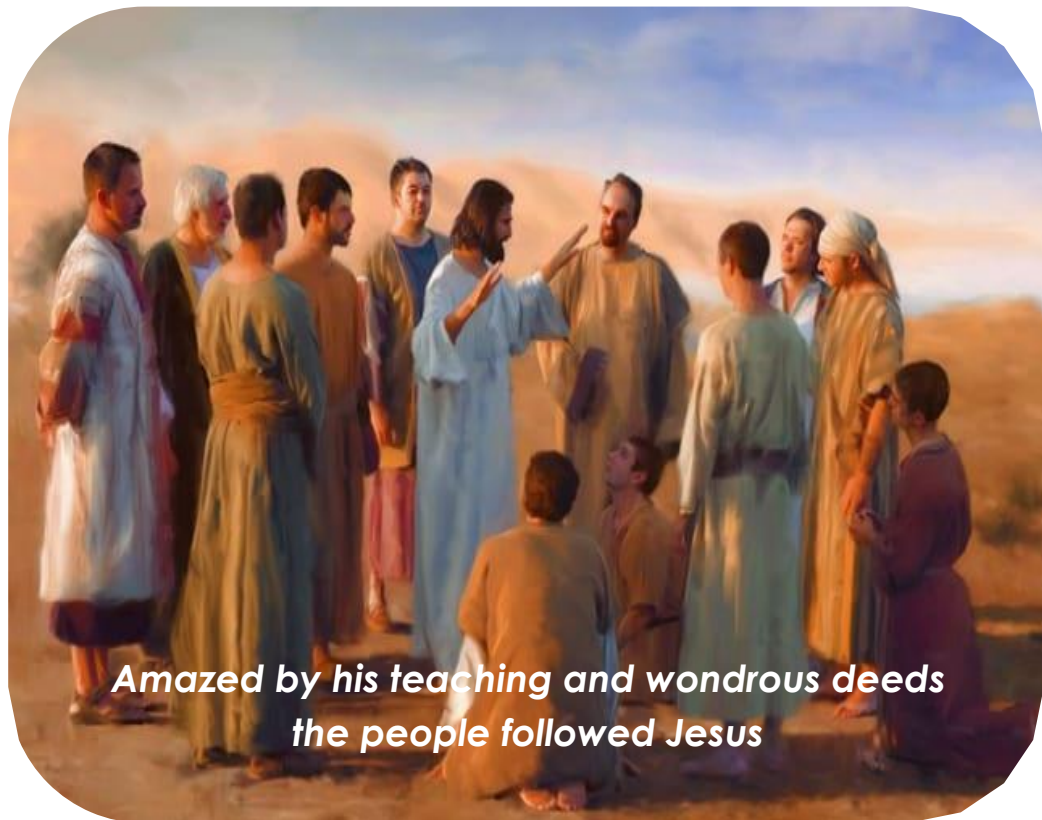

Rectors Muse

I was reflecting this week about the story of a man who helped rescue other passengers from a sinking Ferry Ship. He was just an ordinary passenger, not an officer or member of the crew but with a voice of authority he brought a voice of hope into chaos.

The ship was taking in water and had turned over on its side. The people were in a state of panic and chaos as what was once the floor had now become the wall and within the darkness it was difficult to see where to go. But into this chaos and darkness a man called out in a clear voice and began instructing people to come to him. As the people began to listen and follow his instructions a sense of relief and hope took over them as they were led to safety and eventually lifted off the sinking ship. It was recorded that the man would often reach out into the darkness and make a human bridge for people to hold onto and cross over in to safety.

This rescue account reminds me of the work of our Lord. Seeing the world sinking in darkness and sin. Jesus stooped down into our world to become human and to reach out a saving hand and speak words of authority bringing peace into the chaos and darkness of our lives.

Although through believing in God we believe in supernatural powers at work we do not yet understand this other realm of angels and fallen angels. However, we can all acknowledge that good and evil exist. There are times of chaos, darkness and turmoil in our lives and in the world in which we live. We may even say sometimes that we face our own demons, and trials daily.

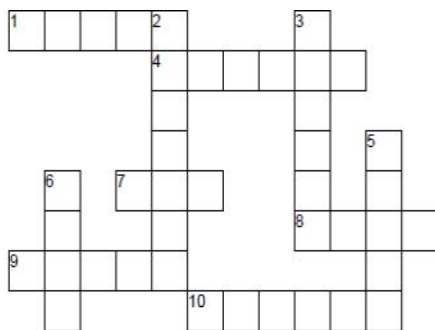
The question is to whom then should we turn?

There are many different voices calling for our attention, claiming we should live this way or that way. Believe this or that and for many people Jesus or Christianity is just another voice in the chaos of many voices. Some even say it doesn't matter what path you take or what you believe.

Imagine an other scenario, you are flying a plane full of passengers screaming and shouting to do this or that and you know you need instructions on how to land safely. Which voice will you listen too? Hopefully you will choose to listen to the voice from the Airport Tower. Likewise in life I hope you will seek out and listen to Jesus, who speaks with authority and with power to save us and bring us to a place of peace.

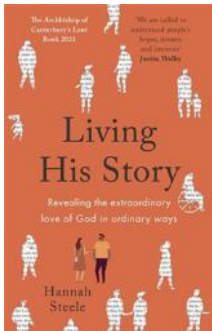
The pain that will not go away,

We are also planning to freely distribute a small booklet based on the Living His Story Book called

#LiveLent: God's Story, Our Story



This is a daily reflections booklet set out for each of the days in Lent. The booklet follows the weekly themes drawn from the Archbishop of Canterbury's Lent Book 2021, Living His Story: Sharing the extraordinary love of God in ordinary ways by Hannah Steele. We pray you will enjoy using this over the Lenten Period for your own prayers and actions.

LENT - A Prayerful Journey

How will you journey through Lent this year? We pray you will use the "#Live Lent" booklet and if you want to study more about God's story and our Story will enjoy reading and using the book Living His Story and join in with one of the planned study groups.

Alongside these Lent resources we are planning to use the Church grounds to offer us all a place for reflection and prayer.

We plan to have 7 Stations marked around the grounds by small crosses leading us to a Large Cross and finally by the end of Lent to the Easter Garden. Each Station will offer us a place to pause and be remind of one of the Biblical account of Jesus journey from the garden of Gethsemane, to the Cross of Calvary, his death and burial and ultimately to Easter and the resurrection.



Each station will also be marked by a painted stone giving a pictorial representation of that part of the journey. If you would like to help by painting one of these stones then please do get in touch with Jacqui.

It is also planned that as we journey through Lent we will also build up an Easter Garden Scene. Our creative team are currently working out how to do this so that it will be thought provoking leading us from garbage tip of Golgotha to the beauty of new life and creation. Closer to Easter we would also love you to come and place a flower pot or flower trough, or bunches of flowers at the Tomb as a sign of our remembrance and thanksgiving for Easter.

Three friends investigate unsafe, often unsavoury practices in the food sector. Their investigations uncovered serious failings, even among fairtrade producers, so they put their money where their sweet tooth was: they turned from journalists to entrepreneurs, setting out to make a "100% slave-free" chocolate bar.
