

# **Tell Your Story**

Over the weeks in Lent we have been reflecting upon how God's wonderful story of love and rescue can be very much part of our own story as we learn that we are loved.

The story of Good News is a remarkable story of redemption, sacrifice and love with the power to transform and renew lives. As we prepare for the celebrations of Palm Sunday and Holy Week which leads us to the cross and the grave of Jesus we are to be reminded of this wonderful story. But it does not end on

Good Friday, the story continues, bringing us to Easter and the resurrection.

God could have chosen to make the news of Jesus resurrection a much more spectacular event with signs and wonders in the sky but God didn't! What God chose to do was to entrust the news firstly to the women at the tomb and then to the disciples before instructing them to go out into the world and tell their story. Even today God continues to use ordinary people like you and me to share the life changing news of the God who loves, and because he loves he gave his son who defeated sin and death for us.

Today the mandate remains the same, to go and tell His story through sharing your story of what God has done for you. What does Easter mean for you? What hope and understanding do you receive from trusting in this amazing resurrection story and how will you share that with others. Our context may be different from those first believers who passed on the story and just like them there is no guarantee that it will be easy.

Nevertheless there is great joy when someone turns to Christ in faith and a wonderful exchange takes place as we share our witness, our experiences and stories of faith with the new followers of Jesus and encourage them to continue to share their story. In this way the early church grew in number and today as we seek God's guidance by the Holy Spirit I pray we too will be encouraged and empowered to share the story and see the church grow.

# Returning to our Church Buildings?

We are all no doubt glad to hear that the COVID reports over the last few weeks have been more positive as more people are vaccinated while the death rate and infection rate are decreasing from where they once were.

Although there is still an air of caution and concern about another spike or new variants to contend with the Scottish Government has given the green light for Churches to begin reopening with restrictions.

Sadly it is not just a case of throwing open the doors. The Vestries and Clergy Team will need to agree on away forward. At the same time the Site Management Team for each church will need to reconvene and ensure once more that our buildings are ready and that everything that is required to open the buildings safely is in place. I will update you on our plans and the provisional dates for opening soon. Please note that there will still be some restrictions in place and we may only be able to let a limited number of people in each week for worship. Do hold us in prayer as we deliberate.


## EASTER OUTDOOR SERVICES

Some good news as we go to print this week's Connect News. After seeking clarification about the reopening of Churches the Scottish Government has confirmed that Churches will be allowed to conduct Outdoor Services.

These will only take place in the defined boundary of the church. With a maximum of 50 people who should be seated, socially distanced and wearing masks. A register of participants will be need to be kept and although congregational singing is discouraged music can be played.

It is our plan therefore to offer some form of outdoor worship at both churches on Good Friday as well as on Easter Sunday. The Clergy Team will be looking at what we can feasibly offer so please keep a look out for details about these special outdoor services.

Remembering that people will need to be seated therefore you may want to look out your deck chairs or picnic rugs for these services.



# Help Raise Funds for St Leonard's

## join the Kiltwalk from April 23rd to 25th

Team "Rise and Shine" wants YOU to join us in walking, having some fun, and raising a few pounds towards our building fund! Don some tartan and bring your furry friend(s) as we go as far as we can go (1 mile, 5K, 10K, or "infinity and beyond!" whatever works for you).

The team's designated charity is St. Leonard's, Lasswade, and the team "leader" is Sashabelle. The team will walk in the King George V Park in Bonnyrigg and wave at St. Leonard's as we loop past at the top of the hill!

Kiltwalk 2021 is an opportunity to raise funds for charity while walking with friends or by yourself (staying within whatever restrictions are in place at the time!). In years past this has been a large group event over a set course, but this year individuals and teams have the flexibility to set their own course and agenda. Individual walkers sign up online (note there is a registration fee) and set individual distance and fundraising goals. As a Kiltwalker you may designate any Scottish charity. Funds raised by Kiltwalking will be then matched at 50% by the Hunter Foundation, so if you get £100 sponsorship, your charity will receive £150. So it is a great opportunity for us.

## Preparing for CoP26 in November in Glasgow 2021

The word 'Fringe' conjures up for me, hot summer days in Edinburgh, with my girls, enjoying free entertainment on the streets of Edinburgh.

Today, I discovered the Climate Fringe CoP<sub>2</sub>6 online https://climatefringe.org/ and have signed up for their newsletter of events, where the arts meet science. It is really uplifting! I have been especially drawn to #100DaysOfGreenNevis, it is almost halfway through the challenge and ends on 11th May, but better late than never. This is just an extract from the daily diary on the website.

For my #100DaysOfGreenNevis challenge I decided to pull together 100 different pieces of music, art or text that in some way relate to the climate crises or our natural world, chosen by 100 different people. I've found it really fascinating to use the pieces picked as starting points to do my own little bits of research into the ideas behind the pieces or how they fit into the bigger context! One of these pieces in particular is so familiar to many it is often thought to be a piece of folk music, but it was fascinating to think about its composition and place of origin through the lens of climate change.

Through our Eco Congregation we have brought an number of different ideas for prayer, information on ecological and ethical discussions, Films on Climate change and a variety of other activities. So this weeks challenge is to tune into the arts and see our world through the eyes of the artist whether it be in art, music or drama.

Can you commit to a 100 days of a sustainable or creative green action of your choosing. This action can be as practical or as creative and wacky as you like, involving music or not as you choose! Here are some ideas to get you started...

- Commit to recycling, donating or selling 100 things you don't need.
- Share an environmental volunteering opportunity everyday.
- Improvise a short piece music inspired by an endangered species
- Go vegetarian or even vegan for 100 days.
- Only buy products that can be recycled.
- Make a Spotify playlist of environmentally/climate change related music by adding a new piece everyday for 100 days

Also don't forget to share what you are doing with family and friends and on your Social Media sites to encourage a wider involvement in the green revolution.
