Dear Friends,


Do you love a good story? Maybe you cuddle up in bed with a good book or watch a film because the story line captures your imagination and intrigues you.

Over these past few weeks our Lent Study Groups and individuals in the church family has been engaging with this years Lent book "Living His Story" and our daily reflections guide "#Live Lent". *(We still have a few free copies of #Live Lent if you would like one).*

Through the studies we have been looking at how Jesus engaged with people through the telling of stories. These stories help us grasp what God and his Kingdom are like.

As people encountered Jesus their lives were challenged and transformed. In just a brief walk through the Gospels we find that; the lame walk, the blind see, the hungry are fed. Troubled and disturbed people are brought to a place of peace and rest.

In this weeks Gospel reading we see Jesus and his disciples encountering a man who was deeply troubled so much so that he would suffer seizures and rip off his clothes and go and live in the local grave yard amongst the tombs. However, meeting with Jesus changes this man life, he is transformed, set free, in a fairly dramatic and public way involving a heard of pigs running of a cliff top into the lake.



Nevertheless, the main point I want to make at this time is that the man through encountering Jesus is transformed by God's transforming love and mercy. But what happens next is a challenge to all of us. Clothed and in his right mind the man longs to go with Jesus and to journey with him but Jesus sends him out on a mission to go and share his story of what God has done for him. This too is the challenge and call that Jesus gives us! This man with only an encounter with Jesus, with no theological training was to go and tell people about Jesus and what he had done for him? Could we do that today?

Many of us often may have a feeling of fear or inadequacy when it comes to sharing our own faith story. Sadly, over time society has taught and enforced in us the misconception that faith is personal and should be kept that way. Surely our faith is not for sharing, sowing and growing? Jesus calls all of us to share his love, his message of hope and life. For some that maybe through public service as a Minister or Evangelist but for many it will be in the small daily acts of friendships with family, neighbours and the wider community that we will sow seeds of hope and good news.

Not many of us are called to be the next Billy Graham hosting big rallies and sharing our faith with thousands but we can all be Albert McMakin's. You have all heard of Billy Graham I hope, but if it wasn't for Albert McMakin's sharing his faith with his college friend Billy then many in the world may never have come to faith through Billy's ministry. Even Billy Graham acknowledged that it was often one individual's relationship with another that brought people to know Jesus. Andrew the disciple brought Peter to meet Jesus. Philip found Nathanael and called him to come, the woman at the well went back into the town and said come and see. The man in the tombs went out into the surrounding towns and shared the personal story of what God had done for him. Friendships and sharing personal stories, with our family and friends are at the very heart of life and those of us who know Jesus are called to begin where we are to share the story. Who knows someone you might share the story of Jesus with might indeed be the next Billy Graham bring hope and good news to many, many more people.

Paschal Candle Motif Competition for Easter 2021.



Hear the Gospel of our Lord according to Luke

Jesus and his followers sailed across to the other side of Lake Galilee. When Jesus got out of the boat, a demon possessed man came to him. For a long time this man had worn no clothes and lived amongst the tombs. The man often suffered from seizures, and was often chained. But he would always break the chains.

When the man saw Jesus, he fell down before him, shouting loudly, "What do you want with me, Jesus, Son of the Most High God? Please, don't punish me!" Jesus asked him, "What is your name?" The man answered, "Legion."

The demons begged Jesus to allow them to go into the pigs who were eating on the hill side. So Jesus commanded them to come out and go into the pigs. The herd of pigs then ran down the hill into the lake, and were drowned.

The men who were caring for the pigs ran away and told the story to the people of the town. They came out to meet Jesus and found the man sitting at the feet of Jesus. He was in his right mind again and clothed; the demons were gone.

When Jesus returned to the boat the man he had healed begged to go with Jesus. But Jesus sent him away, saying, "Go back home and tell people what God has done for you." So the man went all over town telling what Jesus had done for him.
