

# A Guide to worship in the Church

*We are operating within Tier 2 Regulations*



## Step 1 **Please book in advance by the Friday before the Sunday**

Service that you wish to attend. Phone 663 7000  
or email: office.stlandm@gmail.com to book in.

Step 2 **Remember to come** If you find yourself unable to attend please do try and let us know to allow someone else to attend if possible.

Step 3 **On the Sunday bring your mask and keep your distance**  
A 2 metre social distancing is encourage inside and outside the building. If there is a queue please be patient and wait to be welcomed in.



## Step 4 **Mask On - Hands Sanitised - be shown to a seat**



We will welcome you and register your attendance.  
You will be asked to sanitise your hands and then be guided to a seat.  
Please do feel free to say hello to those near by but keep your distance.

## Steps **The Connect News** should be on your seat.



The Liturgy for the service can be found at the back of the Newsletter  
Please take the Connect News home with you. Be still and pray for  
God to bless you and those who gather with us for worship.

Step 6 Please do join in with the worship and responses. Sadly, singing is not to be encouraged but music and hymns will be played.

## Step 7 **Communion - Mask, Sanitise, Receive, - Mask, Sanitise, Return**



At this time only communion bread will be served. When invited to come forward to receive please do so respectfully of others. When you come forward remove your mask, then sanitise your hands before receiving and consuming the bread. Then replace your masks and sanitise your hands before returning to your seat.

It is ok to pass by each other briefly as you move to receive communion. (If you are infirm or unable to come forward the Priest will come to you. Please ask to sit in an accessible place.)

## Step 8 **Leaving the Church**

You will be directed to leave from the seating closest to the door leaving first. Please sanitise your hands as you leave.

As regulations ease we hope to return to offering Tea and Coffee after the service but currently we ask for you to fellowship briefly outside, if the weather allows, while remaining socially distant.

### **The Gospel**      **Mark 6: 14-29** *read by Steve Somerfield*

Hear the Gospel of our Lord according to Mark  
**Glory to Christ our Saviour**

King Herod heard about Jesus and his disciples, for Jesus' had become well known. Some were saying he was 'John the Baptist who had been raised from the dead, and that is why miraculous powers are at work in him.' Others said, 'He is Elijah.' And still others claimed, 'He is a prophet, like one of the prophets of long ago.'

But when Herod heard this, he said, 'John, whom I beheaded, has been raised from the dead!' For Herod himself had given orders to have John arrested, and he had him bound and put in prison. He did this because of Herodias, his brother Philip's wife, whom he had married. For John had been saying to Herod, 'It is not lawful for you to be with your brother's wife.' So Herodias nursed a grudge against John and wanted to kill him. But she was not able to, because Herod feared John and protected him, knowing him to be a righteous and holy man. When Herod heard John, he was greatly puzzled; yet he liked to listen to him.

Finally the opportune time came for Herodias. On Herod Birthday there was a great banquet for the high officials and military commanders and the leading men of Galilee.

When the daughter of Herodias came in and danced, she pleased Herod and his dinner guests. So the king said to the girl, 'Ask me for anything you want, and I'll give it to you.' And he promised her with an oath, 'Whatever you ask I will give you, up to half my kingdom.'

She went out and said to her mother, 'What shall I ask for?' 'The head of John the Baptist,' she answered. At once the girl hurried in to the king with the request: 'I want you to give me right now the head of John the Baptist on a dish.' The king was greatly distressed, but because of his oaths and his dinner guests, he did not want to refuse her. So he immediately sent an executioner with orders to bring John's head. The man went, beheaded John in the prison, and brought back his head on a dish. He presented it to the girl, and she gave it to her mother. On hearing of this, John's disciples came and took his body and laid it in a tomb.


We continue to distribute food parcels every week to a variety of families in their time of need here are some of the things that we are hoping to include in the summer parcels going out in the coming weeks...

## The Link Book Group




Our latest venture was *The Thursday Murder Club* by Richard Osman. The author is one of the boffins on the quiz show *Pointless* and this is his debut novel.

Hello everyone, Margaret here, just a few words of reflection and prayer this week.

Whilst watching the latest Eco film online, **'This Changes Everything'**, I tried to listen with the ears of my heart. My notes scribbled in a notepad, are the words that I hear spoken from the hearts of people crying out for help, some of the poorest communities in faraway places, out of our sight out of our minds.

*"In 1970, a politician announced, 'in our search for fossil fuels, some places will need to become sacrifice places. They are in the middle of nowhere'. Hardly anyone lives in these places."* "A grandmother in her kitchen cries what can one person do?" "Love will save this place, and a Tar Sands healing walk catches everyone's attention."

*"In China 2013: Once we are rich enough, we will deal with climate change. However, a young mother produced a film, when her young child wanted to go outside during yet another polluted day. The Government listened and responded, and China is now the biggest solar panel producer in the world but unfortunately the smog from industry still hangs over the poorest areas in the country."* "A new uprising of environmentalists in India asks: Is the western culture of Growth the only way forward?" "There is a new growth system... care of the earth and of each other. This is no longer about countries but our world. It is a challenge for us all."

Loving God, gracious spirit you breathed life into all creation.

We pray for those struggling with ill health and those who are caring for them. We think especially of those who suffer and need clean air to help their recovery.

We pray that our leaders find just ways to reduce the pollution that collectively we make to the air that we all breathe and the environment we live in. # Annie Naish



Some of you I hope will remember Annie from the visits she made to our Messy Church Events and for being the Bishop's Enabler of Mission. She was often behind the scene but always encouraging me and others to reach out in new ways and was responsible for bringing a new emphasis on mission to the heart and life of the Diocese. Annie is now moving on to work as a Chaplain on board the Mercy Ship. This was also the organisation that Vicki Clark spent some time with a couple of years ago.

Mercy Ships are an incredible charity whose vision is "to follow the example of Jesus bringing hope and healing to the forgotten poor." They work in some of the most deprived countries of the world, mainly in West Africa. With each government they draw up a 4 year protocol to help transform healthcare systems across the nation through training, development, and renovation of facilities. One element of this work is a fully equipped hospital ship mooring in a suitable port for about 10 months, providing life-changing surgery and training. Operations for cataracts, cleft palates, tumours, gynaecological and orthopaedic problems, are all provided for free.

All staff on the Mercy Ship are Volunteers and are self supported which means that Annie and others need to self fund her time on board by asking for family, friends and churches to pray and support her work and the mission. She therefore needs to raise around £900 a month.
