A Guide to worship in the Church

We are operating within LEVEL 0 Regulations



Basic Hygiene

Please remember to wear your mask and use the hand sanitiser when entering and leaving the building



Social Distance 1m

Under Level Zero regulations we are asked to keep at least a 1metre social distance. It is however ok to briefly pass someone in the aisle when moving about the church. When sitting in a Pew please endeavour to keep to the minimum 1m Social Distance guide, both to the side as well as to the front of you.

Signing in Worship



A copy of the Connect News will be on the Pew containing the Liturgy for the service. Please take your copy home with you. We are now allowed to Sing again but sadly we still need to keep our Masks on. So please do feel free to be a Masked Singers

Communion - Mask, Sanitise, Receive, Consume, Replace
When invited to receive the Communion Bread please come forward come forward remove your mask, then sanitise your hands before receiving, consuming and replacing your Mask. If you are unable to come forward the Priest will come to you. To facilitate this please ask to be seated in an accessible place.



Fellowship and Exit

We are working towards resuming our after service fellowship with refreshments but for now we ask you to continue to Exit the building at the end of the service and to have a short time of fellowship outside the building before leaving the grounds.

During the Pandemic it was recommend that soft furnishings be removed or limited in their use as these were deemed to be more difficult to clean than the bare pew. So for a number of weeks now we have had the joy of numb behinds. Now with the reintroduction of the Pew Cushions we hope at least to have taken another step back to church and worship as it was.

However, we are currently taking a cautious approach to reintroduction of our after service cuppa. Hopefully by September we will be able to re-establish our fellowship and refreshment time in church.

Sadly for the foreseeable future our Communion will continue to be distributed in one kind only (bread). Although our Bishop's assure us that this is an acceptable practice most of us long to partake of Bread and Wine. Regardless of whether we receive or not we continue to worship the Lord and give thanks and celebrate God's great love for us as the central act of our Sunday worship together.

Both churches are now open each Sunday at their usual time and I look forward to seeing you soon and worshipping together.



As a Church we are being encouraged to celebrate the Season of Creationtide from September 3rd to October 4th and during that time we will plan to hold our Harvest Festivals and also have a Climate Sunday as we prepare and pray for the discussions and outcomes of the United Nations Conference on Climate Change known as COP26.

A Reading from Ephesians 4:1-16

As a prisoner for the Lord, then, I urge you to live a life worthy of the calling you have received. Be completely humble and gentle; be patient, bearing with one another in love. Make every effort to keep the unity of the Spirit through the bond of peace. There is one body and one Spirit, just as you were called to one hope when you were called; one Lord, one faith, one baptism; one God and Father of all, who is over all and through all and in all. But to each one of us grace has been given as Christ apportioned it.

So Christ himself gave the apostles, the prophets, the evangelists, the pastors and teachers, to equip his people for works of service, so that the body of Christ may be built up until we all reach unity in the faith and in the knowledge of the Son of God and become mature, attaining to the whole measure of the fullness of Christ.

Then we will no longer be infants, tossed back and forth by the waves, and blown here and there by every wind of teaching and by the cunning and craftiness of people in their deceitful scheming. Instead, speaking the truth in love, we will grow to become in every respect the mature body of him who is the head, that is, Christ. From him the whole body, joined and held together by every supporting ligament, grows and builds itself up in love, as each part does its work.
