From the Rector

*"Faith isn't a feeling; It's a choice
to Trust God even when the road ahead seems uncertain."*

Following God is nothing like following a SatNav although there are times I wish God would be a bit clearer in his directions and warnings of what may lie ahead. As pilgrims, disciples following God we are called into a position of placing our faith and trust in the promises and commands of our Lord. It is a way of life built upon choosing to trust and lean on God's ways, the core values and beliefs that guide us as Christians. What does God require? The prophet Micah replies act justly, love mercy and walk humbly with your God.

This week at St Mary's we welcome Anya and James Sawyer who come to be baptised. Our Baptismal vows remind us of the core values and beliefs of our faith. In baptism we are called to acknowledge that God is active in our lives and that we will turn away from sin and turn to Christ. That we will put our faith into action by committing ourselves to love by sharing the good news and serving others while caring for the environment and for one another by working for justice and peace at all times.

Sometimes the road ahead does seem uncertain and there are times that fear and worry can lead us astray. We do need to acknowledge our feelings and bring them to the Lord in prayer. Nevertheless, there comes a fresh day where once again we are called to make a choice. How shall we live today? Will we trust God and live out the call to love as we have been loved?

The Collect

A Reading from Hebrews 9.24-28

Christ did not enter a sanctuary made with human hands that was only a copy of the true one; he entered heaven itself, now to appear for us in God's presence. Nor did he enter heaven to offer himself again and again, the way the high priest enters the Most Holy Place every year with blood that is not his own. Otherwise Christ would have had to suffer many times since the creation of the world. But he has appeared once and for all at the culmination of the ages to do away with sin by the sacrifice of himself. Just as people are destined to die once, and after that to face judgment, so Christ was sacrificed once to take away the sins of many; and he will appear a second time, not to bear sin, but to bring salvation to those who are waiting for him.

The Gospel Reading

Hear the Gospel of our Lord according to Mark 12 v 41-44

Glory to Christ our Saviour.

Jesus sat down opposite the place where the offerings were put and watched the crowd putting their money into the temple treasury. Many rich people and elaborately threw in large amounts. But a poor widow came and put in two very small copper coins, worth only a few pence.

Calling his disciples to him, Jesus said, 'Truly I tell you, this poor widow has put more into the treasury than all the others. They all gave out of their wealth but she out of her poverty, has put in everything, all she had to live on.'
