Test before you go

Everyone should take a Lateral Flow Test before attending a Service or Meeting of the Church.



Basic Hygiene

Please remember to wear your mask and use the hand sanitiser when entering and leaving. Masks are to be worn in public buildings this includes churches.

Social Distance 1m

Keep at least 1m away from other family groups



Worship

Although singing is allowed mask are to be worn at all times. Those involved in leading of the service can be unmasked when speaking. Please take your service sheet home with you.



Communion - Mask, Sanitise, Receive,

When receiving Communion Bread please come forward remove your mask, then sanitise your hands and then receive the bread, consume the bread and replacing your Mask as you return

Wrap Up Warm

Although we warmly welcome you to church we have been asked to provide adequate ventilation during our gatherings. So please come with a good winter coat or additional blanket.

Refreshments & Fellowship

In line with Scottish Episcopal Churches guidance we are sadly suspending the serving of refreshments at this time. We are also encouraging people to Fellowship outdoors at the close of the service.



Vaccinations and Boosters

We encourage everyone to get vaccinated and to have their booster as soon as they can.



Hope for Christmas ???

As we go to print there is a large amount of uncertainty about our Church Service as the Tsunami of Omicron COVID infections rises over Christmas and into the new year.

Although the Scottish Government has not yet asked Churches to close, we have all been advised to stay in and limit our mixing with other people. By getting vaccinated or boosted, cleaning our hands, staying social distant and wearing a mask are all ways we can minimise receiving or passing on the virus.

The Current plans are to hold the following services but we ask you to consider attending only one service over the Christmas Weekend. We also ask you to take a Lateral Flow Test before attending (*in theory this should be done about 1 hour before attending a service*). From the Rector

Love never fails.

For now we see only a reflection as in a mirror;
then we shall see face to face. Now these three remain:
faith, hope and love. But the greatest of these is love.

From 1 Corinthians 13

Our Advent journey ends with the theme of Love as we gather around a stable scene and with awe we marvel at the greatest story of love we have ever known. A story that we too are called into. A tale, from our heritage and past but comes to us a fresh each year that God loves us, and comes to us in the Immanuel, in the Christ Child as Jesus our promised King



We look into the stable and come to the crib where Jesus, the human vulnerable baby and yet the divine God, reminds us again that he is here with us in our world. He is our Immanuel, not a distant God but God who is near us. Through the incarnation of God becoming man, we become known to God, our experiences have been experienced by the Lord. The joys and sorrows of life, the pain of rejection and loss, the joy of family and friendships, the highs and lows of life and ultimately even death.

In the midst of the Nativity scene it can sometimes be so easy to romanticise the story. We pause for a moment and enjoy the picture of a new born baby, loved by his parents, surrounded by wondering Shepherds and worshipping wisemen, while animals nibble on the straw of the manger, the bed of the new born King. But even there within this surreal setting where Hope, Peace, Joy and Love meet there is a glimpse of something more.

The story of old moves on, as we too will move on from the stable scene into the unknown, to face the darkness and whatever lies before us. Yet I pray that because we have taken time to stopped and reflected again and remembered this part of the great story of love we will journey onward with Hope in our steps, Peace in our lives, Joy in our hearts and forever be surrounded with Love. Our Hope, Peace, Joy and Love come from God, who is and was and is to come, Christ Jesus, our Immanuel.


