on the Advent journey

From the Rector

***"In the tender compassion of our God
the dawn from on high shall break upon us,
To shine on those who dwell in darkness and the shadow of death,
and to guide our feet into the way of peace.***

Our theme within the second week of Advent is peace. Peace not as the world gives, temporary and often fractious, but a peace from God. The peace of God is filled with reassurance that all will be well. That come what may, ultimately our souls are safe in Christ, the boat maybe rocked in the storms of life but one day we will reach heavens safe harbour.

Advent is a time to remember and give thanks for God's faithfulness throughout the generations and to remember our salvation story. Today in our reading from Luke's gospel we encounter the wonderful song of Zechariah's, which may be better known as the Benedictus. Zechariah is the father of John the Baptist. You may recall that after encountering an Angel of the Lord Zechariah had been struck dumb. The Angel had told him that Elizabeth, his wife, even though she was old and barren would become pregnant. However, due to Zechariah's disbelief that God would use an elderly man and his wife in this way the Angel stopped him from speaking until the day that they named the child John. On that day we read that Zechariah filled with the Holy Spirit spoke the words that we read in today's Gospel.

Zechariah's song is filled and brimming over with praise for God reminding us of what God has done and is doing for us. We are therefore encouraged to trust in the Lord who; sets us free, who raises up a saviour for us and calls us to walk in the ways of peace. Zechariah's son John will herald in the call for all of us to turn and repent of our sins and worship the Lord without fear.

A new day is dawning, the light of Christ shines upon us and calls us out of darkness and death into the ways of life and peace. Let us therefore respond and turn afresh to the Lord who blesses us and bless the Lord with our thanks and praise as we commit ourselves to walk in the way of peace.

The Collect

A Reading from the book of Malachi 3.1-4

'I will send my messenger, who will prepare the way before me. Then suddenly the Lord you are seeking will come to his temple; the messenger of the covenant, whom you desire, will come,' says the Lord Almighty.

But who can endure the day of his coming? Who can stand when he appears? For he will be like a refiner's fire or a launderer's soap. He will sit as a refiner and purifier of silver; he will purify the Levites and refine them like gold and silver. Then the Lord will have a people who will bring offerings in righteousness, and the offerings of Judah and Jerusalem will be acceptable to the Lord, as in days gone by, as in former years.

we enter into our heritage
in the company of the Virgin Mary,
the apostles and prophets,
and of all our brothers and sisters living and departed.**

in the unity of the Holy Spirit,
all honour and glory be to you,
Lord of all ages, world without end.




