Welcome to Worship

We give a warm welcome to everyone who is able to join with us for this weeks worship.

Our Gospel reading for this Sunday is the account of Jesus transfiguration. Peter, James and John are given a glimpse of something mysterious. They are given a glimpse of life beyond the grave, as Moses and Elijah meet with the transformed Jesus radiant in splendour and majesty. The scene points us to consider and have hope in what lies ahead for all of us. What will life be like?

Sadly there is much uncertainty just now with the Russian invasion of Ukraine taking place as I write this weeks Connect news. We pray for the world and the people of the Ukraine praying for peace, praying for a withdrawal of forces back behind their borders. We pray for our friends and family members who are worried about their own family and friends who live in the Ukraine and other nations who once were part of the USSR.

Likewise as we move into the new norm of living with COVID we step forward cautiously uncertain of what lies ahead of us. As a Church we will be using Lent (*which begins this week*) as a time of reflection and preparation for Easter and also for the new life to come. Over Lent we will be focusing in on refreshing and renewing our faith in God who believes in us, in God who calls us into his family and calls us to be active with deeds of love and service. All of this while beginning to explore what is God calling us to do more specifically as each individual church and also what we can do together. It is a challenging time but like a gardener looking out at our garden now is the time to prepare the groundwork and clear out that which needs to be cleared, nurture and tend to that which will remain and prepare the ground for what new seeds and plants we want to sow or plant.

So although there is a degree of uncertainty and worry let us hold on by faith in the hope that we have in Christ Jesus, that one day there will be a great peace and all the pain and sorrow will end in the life beyond the grave.

Jesus then took Peter, John and James with him and went up onto a mountain to pray. As he was praying, the appearance of his face changed, and his clothes became as bright as a flash of lightning. Two men, Moses and Elijah, appeared in glorious splendour, talking with Jesus. They spoke about his departure, which he was about to bring to fulfilment at Jerusalem. Peter and his companions were very sleepy, but when they became fully awake, they saw his glory and the two men standing with him. As the men were leaving Jesus, Peter said to him, 'Master, it is good for us to be here. Let us put up three shelters – one for you, one for Moses and one for Elijah.' (He did not know what he was saying.) While he was speaking, a cloud appeared and covered them, and they were afraid as they entered the cloud. A voice came from the cloud, saying, 'This is my Son, whom I have chosen; listen to him.' When the voice had spoken, they found that Jesus was alone. The disciples kept this to themselves and did not tell anyone at that time what they had seen.

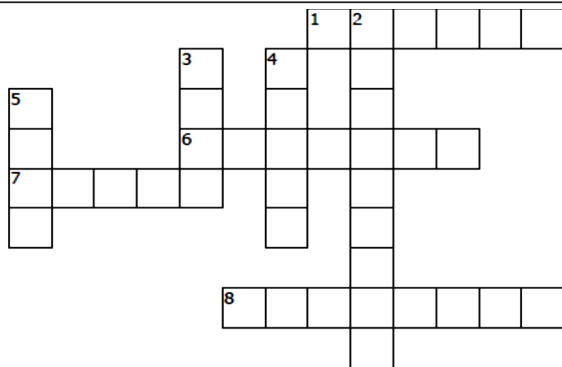

When someone admires something, we are wearing, most of us are well used to saying, 'I bought it in a charity shop', but how many of us can say, 'I found it at a swap shop'?

Well, it's going to be the new expression of 2022, as we launch our first *Swap Shop*

So, what's a Swap Shop?

- It's a free event. No money is exchanged for the 'swap'
- The idea is to prevent the waste of old items going to landfill and the unnecessary purchase of new ones.
- You may take from the table without bringing if you can make use of something available.
- Although it is a free event sometimes people may wish to show their appreciation for the swap. A donations box will be made available, and the contributions will be split between St Mary's and St Leonard's for church funds.
- Any items brought to the table that are not taken are simply removed by the owner at the end of the coffee morning. (If you are unable to attend in person you can decide with someone to oversee your items and remove them if required)
- There will be a theme each month to keep its focus as a swap shop.

So, for the launch of our first Swap Shop, the theme is ***Scarves and Jewellery*** we need you and family members to look out any unwanted scarves, men's, ladies and children's and unwanted costume jewellery. Bring them along to church on Saturday for our first swapping event.

This is an event that your friends may enjoy too, so invite them along for some fellowship. It is hoped that everyone will find this not just an action for the environment but an opportunity for fun and laughter, as we browse, chat, and encourage one another to swap not shop.
