Sunday 5th June Pentecost



Pentecost is often referred to as the birthday of the Christian Church. We remember that after Jesus' death and resurrection he continued to appear and give convincing proof that he was physically alive before ascending into heaven to sit at the right hand of the Father. However, before leaving he promised that we would not be left as orphans. We would not be abandoned by God but that God in a new way would come to us and live with us through the indwelling of the Holy Spirit. This was God's birthday gift to the new church that was birthed on the day of Pentecost.

Today we still believe and proclaim that the Lord is here, his Spirit is with us. The Holy Spirit like a present, a gift, is given to each of us for God knows what we need. Nevertheless, like all gifts we are required to acknowledge and give thanks for the gift. We also need to treasure the gift, not just leave the gift wrapped up, hidden away in a closet.

I remember on one occasion, a birthday or maybe it was at Christmas, I received the gift of a new bicycle. Now I could have sat and looked at this gift and admired it. But how sad it would have been if that was all I did. The bicycle was there to be my companion, my mode of transport as a child to help me travel from A to B often via C and D.

To grow as a follower of Jesus we have to unwrap the present and welcome the Spirit's presence and guidance in our lives. We then are encouraged to work with God by his Spirit's presence in us to seek to grow the Fruit of the Spirit. The Fruit of the Spirit is like the hallmarks, the key characteristics, of how we are called to live as disciples of Jesus. Galatians 5 v22-23 informs us that "the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, forbearance, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control."

As we invite the Spirit to work in us we seek to be fruitful. I pray that each of us as followers of Christ will be open to the Spiritual work of prayer, study and action as we are guided by the gift and indwelling of the Spirit.

Reading Acts 2.1-6 & 12-21

When the day of Pentecost came, they were all together in one place. Suddenly a sound like the blowing of a violent wind came from heaven and filled the whole house where they were sitting. They saw what seemed to be tongues of fire that separated and came to rest on each of them. All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other tongues, as the Spirit enabled them.

Now there were staying in Jerusalem God-fearing Jews from every nation under heaven. When they heard this sound, a crowd came together in bewilderment, because each one heard their own language being spoken.

Amazed and perplexed, they asked one another, 'What does this mean?' Some, however, made fun of them and said, 'They have had too much wine.'

Then Peter stood up with the Eleven, raised his voice and addressed the crowd: 'Fellow Jews and all of you who live in Jerusalem, let me explain this to you; listen carefully to what I say. These people are not drunk, as you suppose. It's only nine in the morning! No, this is what was spoken by the prophet Joel:

“In the last days, God says,
I will pour out my Spirit on all people.
Your sons and daughters will prophesy,
your young men will see visions,
your old men will dream dreams.
Even on my servants, both men and women,
I will pour out my Spirit in those days,
and they will prophesy.

I will show wonders in the heavens above
and signs on the earth below,
blood and fire and billows of smoke.

The sun will be turned to darkness and the moon to blood
before the coming of the great and glorious day of the Lord.
And everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved.”

through it God's voice is heard.

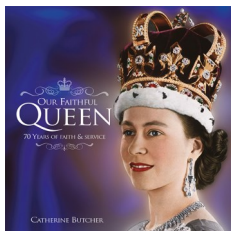
Without your help we fail our Lord,

In the name of Christ. Amen.

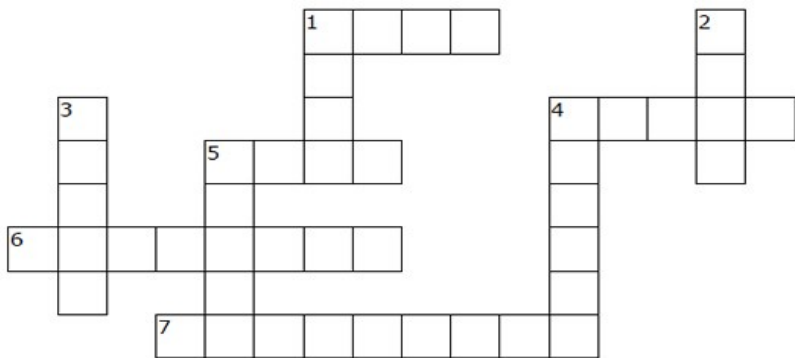
