**One more step along the world I go;
from the old things to the new
keep me traveling along with you:**

As I write and prepare for Sunday worship I am also preparing for a meeting of the joint vestries. This joint meeting is an opportunity for the Vestry members to come together to discuss and explore the future of what is known as "the charge of St Leonard's and St Mary's". This I envision will be the first of a more regular pattern of meetings together to discuss issues that often need a decision to be taken by both Vestries.

We are not meeting to look at how we close this or that church. I am aware that our brothers and sisters in the Church of Scotland are currently undertaking a review and reorganisation of parish ministry. As part of that they are looking to close a number of churches in our area. However, there is no such order from the Scottish Episcopal Church or our Bishop who is in fact wanting us to look at mission and growth.

My own personal view is that although both churches do face some real challenges, which may make us feel vulnerable and at risk, there is still life and opportunity within both churches. Therefore, the Vestries, Clergy Team and I are not looking to close either of our churches. However, we are using this time of visioning to explore how we might function better as a Linked Charge. One area that has already been highlighted by the visioning questionnaire is a desire for us to look at the timings of Sunday Services. Could there be another pattern or approach rather than our current setup? Could both churches meet at the same time within their own buildings? How would these services be staffed and organised. What would the benefits be? Could there be a later afternoon service with afternoon tea. Or an evening service with hot chocolate and different styles of worship.

Regardless, the next step is to open up the discussion between the two Vestries and seek a common mind about possible ways forward. We seek to step forward in faith, with prayer and with the promised Holy Spirit journeying with us as we seek to grow and deepen our relationship with God and each other. Two churches, linked, I pray in love and in support of each other for the glory of Christ our Lord.

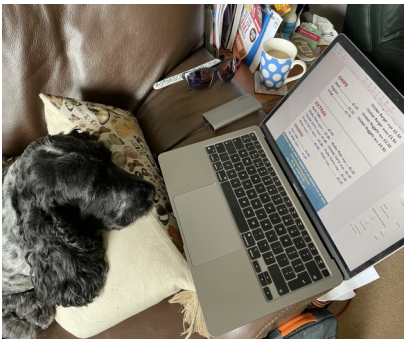
Hospitality and Welcome

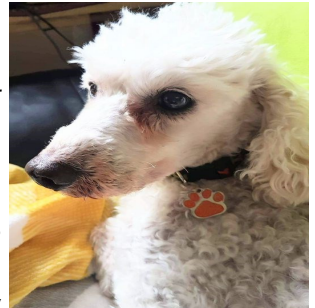


Many thanks to everyone again for your love and support and telling Dad that you miss my articles in the Connect News.

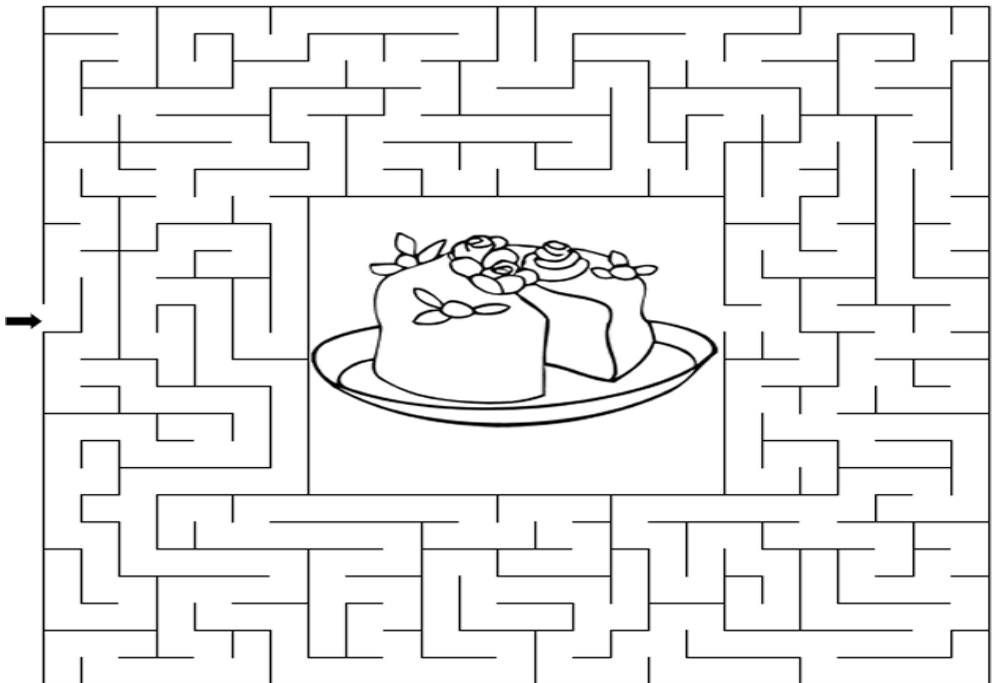

Notes & Scribbles



Super Easy Chocolate Oreo Torte (Vegan)

Ingredients

The Base

- 30 Oreo cookies
- 85g/ $\frac{3}{8}$ cup vegan butter/spread, melted (eg Vitalite Dairy Free)

The Ganache filling

- 170g/6 oz vegan dark chocolate (plus a little extra for topping)
- 170g/6 oz vegan milk chocolate
- 250ml/1 cup vegan double cream (eg Elmlea Plant)
- 55g/4 tbsp vegan butter/spread



Instructions

The Base

Pulse Oreo cookies in a food processor until finely ground, or crush in a bag using a rolling pin.

Transfer crumbs to a medium bowl, add the melted butter then mix thoroughly until combined and moistened.

Press the mixture onto the bottom of a 9-inch (23cm) round cake tin.

(A cake tin with a detachable base works best for this recipe.)

Place the tin in the fridge for 30 minutes.

The Ganache

Whilst the base is chilling, make the filling. In a medium heatproof bowl, place chopped dark and milk chocolate and set aside.

In a small saucepan, heat the cream and vegan butter to a low boil.

Remove from the heat and pour the mixture over the chocolate. Then stir the mixture until melted, combined and smooth.

Pour the filling mixture over the chilled Oreo crust base and refrigerate until set – for a minimum of four hours or overnight.

Using a grater or vegetable peeler, grate the remaining chocolate over the top of the finished torte for decoration.
