So then, just as you received Christ Jesus as Lord, continue to live your lives in him, rooted and built up in him, strengthened in the faith as you were taught, and overflowing with thankfulness.

See to it that no one takes you captive through hollow and deceptive philosophy, which depends on human tradition and the elemental spiritual forces of this world rather than on Christ.

For in Christ all the fullness of the Deity lives in bodily form, and in Christ you have been brought to fullness. He is the head over every power and authority. In him you were also circumcised with a circumcision not performed by human hands. Your whole self ruled by the flesh was put off when you were circumcised by Christ, having been buried with him in baptism, in which you were also raised with him through your faith in the working of God, who raised him from the dead.

When you were dead in your sins and in the uncircumcision of your flesh, God made you alive with Christ. He forgave us all our sins, having cancelled the charge of our legal indebtedness, which stood against us and condemned us; he has taken it away, nailing it to the cross. One day Jesus' disciples ask, 'Lord, teach us to pray'



The Visioning Questionnaire - a Summary Part 2

Last week I gave a brief reflection on questions 1-4 of our recent Questionnaire responses and so this week I will reflect on some of the responses from questions 5-8.

Q5 What can we do to offer more care and support for the elderly and vulnerable in our congregation/community?

Responses: Offer a short once a month afternoon service with afternoon tea. Make contact with Social Services to help identify needs and opportunities to engage with the elderly. Offer or organise transport to and from church. Pastoral Group do an amazing amount of work already what does the Rector do? Services in Care Homes, offering Home Communion.

I acknowledge that we are often regarded as a small church but amazingly we do many good things through the good will and support of many individuals for which we give thanks. Over the testing time of the pandemic the Pastoral Groups rose to the challenge and we quickly set up a telephone network committing ourselves to phoning and caring for those connected with the church. Alongside this Fiona and myself began regular weekly visits to many of our elderly and vulnerable people who did not have access to the internet to distribute a hard copy of the connect news.

As we continue into the future before us pastoral care will remain one of the main areas of concern. So our thanks go to all those on the Pastoral groups who help serve the church in this way. Moving forward there are a number

of good ideas possibilities. I like the idea of a monthly afternoon tea service. Likewise a more coordinated approach to offering lifts may be possible and maybe we could enquire about using the community minibuses? As Rector in the coming term I will be committing myself to phoning and if requested visiting you and everyone on our current membership list.

Q6 How can we encourage children and youth to discover Christian faith?

Responses: Messy Church is good but how do we build on this, I don't know, this is a job for the Clergy, engaging with schools, work with other churches doing youth work. Start a Sunday School or a Family service. Welcome them when they come. Employ a Youth or Family worker instead of a Rector.

I acknowledge that along with many other churches we often struggle to engage with families, children and young people. We do have a number of existing connections and activities with families and young people but as we don't often see them on a Sunday morning we often forget they are there. One of the guestions to consider going forward is what is the focus of Sunday Morning Services? Do we want families and young people to be part of the Sunday worship and if yes how should we make them welcome? We give thanks for the work of Messy Church and aspire to build upon this work. The profile of our Ecumenical Youth Fellowship (12 to 17's)needs to be raised as it regularly meets during term time. It was launched an number of years ago and at one point the majority of those attending were from our own churches. Looking forward there are plans to support a Young Adults group for those that 17+. As a church we do have a number of resources and people with the skill set to do various roles but if we are serious about Families, Children and Young People then maybe we do need to look at investing in a Youth or Families worker so that we can offer more than what we are currently offering.

Q7. How can we engage in the wider community better?

Responses: Improve our communications, raise our profile, leaflet drop new housing, involving ourselves in other community events, Church and or Hall being used by the community, host more events for the community. Find out needs of different community groups, run Alpha or discussion groups giving people an opportunity to explore Christianity.

It was encouraging to read about the openness and desire we have not just to be a church open for worship but to have our grounds and building open and used by the community. Over the last few months St Mary's has shown that the building can be creatively used by a number of different groups. This has come about by a few of our members volunteering with other community groups and then inviting them to consider using the church. So our question going forward might be what groups are you involved in and would you be open to inviting them to come and use the our buildings? Community engagement builds up links with individuals and helps raise our profile in the community. From there invitations could flow to welcome people on to a discussion group or course and hopefully even to come and join with us for worship.

Since the Questionnaire took place there has been concerns expressed about the cost of living crisis we are all facing and what our response might be as a church. There is an increase in the use of Food Banks and even a thought that people may need a Heat Bank, a place of warmth? The idea is to offer a place of warmth, a cuppa and chat to those in need. Could we do this? How would it work?

Q8 What should the church do to be a centre of hope In your community?

Responses: Church open for prayer/solace, prayer activity in grounds, a place for people to leave requests for prayer

On reflection Q8 is similar to Q7. Nevertheless the responses generally called for the church to be open and used a place of prayer. We are currently looking at opening St Mary's and are planning to have CCTV system fitted to provide both a deterrent and some form of security for the building. At both churches we are looking also at how to use the grounds more. St Leonard's has begun sprucing itself up with some much needed garden work and the painting of the hall in the coming months we hope to continue to clear and better define the garden and look at how to use it as a place of welcome.

The Vestries and Clergy Team and the congregations will continue to look at the response that have been made. Where we can act we will try and accommodate some of the suggestions. Other ideas may need to be further thought through and budget for if required. Overall we seek to be faithful to God, to care for one another and to reach out in love to every generation.
