

Reading 2 Timothy 3.14 - 4.5

As for you, continue in what you have learned and have become convinced of, because you know those from whom you learned it, and how from infancy you have known the Holy Scriptures, which are able to make you wise for salvation through faith in Christ lesus

All Scripture is God-breathed and is useful for teaching, rebuking, correcting and training in righteousness, so that the servant of God may be thoroughly equipped for every good work.

If you would be interested in exploring with Peter, our Rector what this may involve please do speak to him or any member of the Clergy Team.




Providing a Welcome and Accommodation

Link Book Club

A WALK IN THE WOODS By Bill Bryson

The Book Club met at the Justinlees recently and over the burgers and fish and chips reviewed Bill Byson's book which has also been made into a film starring Robert Redford and Nick Nolte.

This was a classic Bryson offering as he described his attempt to walk the Appalachian Trail, the longest footpath in the world at 2,2000 miles along the east coast of the US from Georgia to Maine. He was accompanied by his friend, Katz who provided most of the comical elements of the tale as the latter was initially grossly overweight with no real clue about hiking and so started with completely inappropriate gear. Byson describes the wilderness along with animal encounters, weather, accommodation, both luxury and inhospitable and getting very lost and very wet! He added a lot of information about geology, ecological disasters and history. Inevitably he found he could not do the whole trail end to end and instead did bits of it which was far more practical. This was an enjoyable read but the usual Bryson formula.
