We now obey your Son's command. We recall his blessed passion and death, his glorious resurrection and ascension; and we look for the coming of his Kingdom. Made one with him, we offer you these gifts and with them ourselves, a single, holy, living sacrifice.

Hear us, most merciful Father, and send your Holy Spirit upon us and upon this bread and this wine, that, overshadowed by his life-giving power, they may be the Body and Blood of your Son, and we may be kindled with the fire of your love and renewed for the service of your Kingdom.

Help us, who are baptised into the fellowship of Christ's Body to live and work to your praise and glory; may we grow together in unity and love until at last, in your new creation, we enter into our heritage in the company of the Virgin Mary, the apostles and prophets, and of all our brothers and sisters living and departed.

Through Jesus Christ our Lord, with whom, and in whom, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all honour and glory be to you, Lord of all ages, world without end. **Amen.**



Link Book Club

A WALK IN THE WOODS By Bill Bryson

The Book Club met at the Justinlees recently and over the burgers and fish and chips reviewed Bill Byson's book which has also been made into a film starring Robert Redford and Nick Nolte.

This was a classic Bryson offering as he described his

attempt to walk the Appalachian Trail, the longest footpath in the world at 2,2000 miles along the east coast of the US from Georgia to Maine. He was accompanied by his friend, Katz who provided most of the comical elements of the tale as the latter was initially grossly overweight with no real clue about hiking and so started with completely inappropriate gear. Byson describes the wilderness along with animal encounters, weather, accommodation, both luxury and inhospitable and getting very lost and very wet! He added a lot of information about geology, ecological disasters and history. Inevitably he found he could not do the whole trail end to end and instead did bits of it which was far more practical. This was an enjoyable read but the usual Bryson formula.
