

Welcome

This week as we gather for worship our Gospel reading comes from Luke 19 where Jesus encounters Zacchaeus up a tree. As I read this familiar story I was transported back in my mind to my Sunday School days and can remember

dramatizing this story and pretending to climb a tree to see Jesus and singing the song Zacchaeus was a very little man and very little man was he.

I began then to wonder what obstacles exist today that may be hindering people from clearly seeing Jesus. In Jesus day the Tax collector, often appointed by the Roman Governor, was shunned by his local community as someone who was collaborating with the enemy. Therefore they were often rejected and treated as sinner, especially by the self righteous religious people of the day. I wonder are there people today that are looking for Jesus who find themselves rejected by the very institution that should be welcoming them in? We too therefore need to be aware of our own attitudes, judgments or actions and endeavour to remain humble and not to block the way to Jesus but allow God to work in and through to call others.

Another thought that came to mind was the words of Jesus declaring to Zacchaeus "I must stay at your house today"! How would I respond if I were Zacchaeus? Equally it is not about me our you being Zacchaeus but again its about our attitude towards entertaining Jesus.

Are we willing to welcome Jesus in to our homes? To be our honoured guest? Not for us to choose when we want to meet Jesus and decide to give him a visit on a Sunday morning at his house when we can encounter Jesus within our worship, but to awake every morning and acknowledge that Jesus is living with us under our roof. How would our lives change if we truly lived this way, having breakfast, lunch and dinner with Jesus.

So let us be encouraged to be the people of God who help others to see Jesus, by welcoming Jesus to live in us and work through us in our daily lives.

Hear the Gospel of our Lord according to Luke 19.1-10 Glory to Christ our Saviour

Jesus entered Jericho and was passing through. A man was there by the name of Zacchaeus; he was a chief tax collector and was wealthy. He wanted to see who Jesus was, but because he was short he could not see over the crowd. So he ran ahead and climbed a sycamore-fig tree, since Jesus was coming that way.

When Jesus reached the spot, he looked up and said to him, 'Zacchaeus, come down immediately. I must stay at your house today.' So he came down at once and welcomed him gladly.

All the people saw this and began to mutter, 'He has gone to be the guest of a sinner.'

But Zacchaeus stood up and said, 'Look, Lord! Here and now I give half of my possessions to the poor, and if I have cheated anybody out of anything, I will pay back four times the amount.'

Jesus said to him, 'Today salvation has come to this house, because this man, too, is a son of Abraham. For the Son of Man came to seek and to save the lost.'

Glory and thanksgiving be to you, most loving Father, for the gift of your Son born in human flesh.

He is the Word existing beyond time, both source and final purpose, bringing to wholeness all that is made. Obedient to your will he died upon the Cross. By your power you raised him from the dead. He broke the bonds of evil and set your people free to be his Body in the world.

We now obey your Son's command.
We recall his blessed passion and death,
his glorious resurrection and ascension;
and we look for the coming of his Kingdom.
Made one with him, we offer you these gifts
and with them ourselves, a single, holy, living sacrifice.

Hear us, most merciful Father, and send your Holy Spirit upon us and upon this bread and this wine, that, overshadowed by his life-giving power, they may be the Body and Blood of your Son, and we may be kindled with the fire of your love and renewed for the service of your Kingdom.

Help us, who are baptised into the fellowship of Christ's Body to live and work to your praise and glory; may we grow together in unity and love until at last, in your new creation, we enter into our heritage in the company of the Virgin Mary, the apostles and prophets, and of all our brothers and sisters living and departed.

Through Jesus Christ our Lord, with whom, and in whom, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all honour and glory be to you, Lord of all ages, world without end. **Amen.**

If you would be interested in exploring with Peter, our Rector what this may involve please do speak to him or any member of the Clergy Team.




Providing a Welcome and Accommodation
