



2nd Sunday of Advent - Peace



Dear Friends,

During this season of Advent and preparation for Christmas we will no doubt hear many different song or Carols. You may have a favourite or two. During Advent I especially like O come O come Emmanuel but there are two other wonderful songs that we encounter as we journey towards Christmas.

The first of these two songs we encounter at the start of this weeks Sunday worship as we recite the words of the Benedictus or song of Zechariah from Luke 1:68-79 and then next week we will hear Mary's song known as the Magnificat.

Zechariah's song reminds us of God's faithfulness and his purposes and promises. Zechariah is the Father of John the Baptist who comes proclaiming the way of the Lord. Zechariah and Elizabeth were in their golden years when God blessed them with a son, whom they were to name John. The meaning of John's name reminds us that God is good and gracious.

Zechariah initially could not believe God's messenger and so he questioned the idea of his wife in her old age becoming pregnant. In response the Angel struck him dumb and unable to speak he was reduced to writing on a tablet until the day came when he wrote the word's "His name is John!" Then his mouth was unbounded and he was able to speak again and outflowed this song of praise that we know today as the Benedictus, coming from the Latin for "Benedictus Dominus Deus Israel" which we translate as "Blessed be the Lord God of Israel"

Zechariah, praises God because he knows that his son is the promised forerunner to the Messiah, the one who will come and prepare the way of the Lord. A new day is dawning, the old promises are coming true. The dawn from on high is breaking upon us, shining on us who have dwelt in sin and darkness for too long and calls us out from the ways of death and destruction into the ways of peace. John's call to repent is calling us to a fresh new start, and prepares us to walk in the way of peace.

The Gospel Reading

Hear the Gospel of the Lord according to Matthew 3: 1-12

Glory to Christ our Saviour.

John the Baptist came, preaching in the wilderness of Judea saying,
'Repent, for the kingdom of heaven has come near.'

This is he who was spoken of through the prophet Isaiah:

'A voice of one calling in the wilderness, "Prepare the way for the Lord,
make straight paths for him.'"

John's clothes were made of camel's hair, and he had a leather belt
round his waist. His food was locusts and wild honey. People went out
to him from Jerusalem and all Judea. Confessing their sins, they were
baptised by him in the River Jordan.

But when he saw many of the Pharisees and Sadducees coming to where he was baptising, he said to them: 'You brood of vipers! Who warned you to flee from the coming wrath? Produce fruit in keeping with repentance. And do not think you can say to yourselves, "We have Abraham as our father." I tell you that out of these stones God can raise up children for Abraham. The axe has been laid to the root of the trees, and every tree that does not produce good fruit will be cut down and thrown into the fire.

'I baptise you with water for repentance. But after me comes one who is more powerful than I, whose sandals I am not worthy to carry. He will baptise you with the Holy Spirit and fire. His winnowing fork is in his hand, and he will clear his threshing-floor, gathering his wheat into the barn and burning up the chaff with unquenchable fire.'

Give thanks to the Lord for his glorious Gospel.

COVID

No longer a Pandemic but still a concern

Mike Jones as a member of the SIM Mission Agency recently made a presentation to their Health Advisory Committee outlining the current situation regarding COVID and encouraging people to be vaccinated and have the Vaccination boosters. Here is a summary of his main points:

1. **In Scotland the epidemic continues to decline.** ICU admissions and deaths from Covid for the last year are all falling. The amount of virus isolated in sewage has also fallen and is at the lowest level since scientists started monitoring sewage.
2. **The COVID virus continues to evolve.** New variants are more transmissible and only somewhat less dangerous than the original virus. At the moment Omicron BA.5 predominates in the UK, but it is likely being replaced by a Omicron BQ.1
3. **COVID in unvaccinated older people can still cause severe disease and death.** Deaths were 18x more likely in Hong Kong where fewer older people had been vaccinated than in New Zealand which had vaccinated most of the population and total cases were similar.
4. **Vaccines are very, very safe** and far, far less dangerous than repeated significant bouts of infection which may and can damage your health for up to 6 months after each bout.
5. **Newer vaccines provide better protection than the original ones.**
6. **Long Covid can occur after repeated bouts of milder infection** and vaccine reduces the risk of getting Long Covid.
7. **Vaccine boosters give much better immune protection than repeated bouts of COVID infection**

Taking on board Mike's advice we encourage all our members to be vaccinated and to receive their boosters.


