Weekly News from St Leonard's and St Mary's
4th Sunday of Advent - Love



Dear Friends,

On our fourth and final week of the advent season we light our candle for the theme of Love, for God is love.

Over the last four weeks we have looked at the Hope of Advent as we heard again the promises of old and how this hope of salvation came true in the birth, life and death of Jesus, our Lord.

We then noted in the second week the Peace of Advent, that in the gift of the promised messiah we can come to a place of being at peace with God and each other through repenting of our sins and turning back to God. On the third week we lit the candle for Joy. A time of rejoicing in God's marvellous plans as we remembered Mary's song the Magnificat as she proclaimed the greatness of God and was filled with joy that He is the God who keeps his promises. In this fourth week of Advent we remind ourselves of the fundamental truth at the heart of our faith, that God is love. It is out of love for us that God's salvation plan is born. In love, our Emmanuel comes to live among us, to be one with us, to share in our lives, the joys and the sorrows, that we might in the mystery of faith share in the life of Christ. Saint Paul when writing about God's great love then poses the question If God is for us who can be against us? He then goes on to declare in Romans 8

Who shall separate us from the love of Christ? Shall trouble or hardship or persecution or famine or nakedness or danger or sword? ... No, in all these things we are more than conquerors through him who loved us. For I am convinced that neither death nor life, neither angels nor demons, neither the present nor the future, nor any powers, neither height nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God that is in Christ Jesus our Lord. (Romans 8:35-39)

God is for us and God is with us, and God is working his purposes out as we continue to give thanks for the birth of Christ and await his return, to take us home.

Collect

Heavenly Father, who chose Mary and Joseph, to be the mother and father of our Lord and Saviour: fill us with your grace, that we in all things may know you are our loving saving Emmanuel through Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever.

Reading of Scripture **Isaiah 7.11-16**

'Ask the Lord your God for a sign, whether in the deepest depths or in the highest heights.' But Ahaz said, 'I will not ask; I will not put the Lord to the test.'

Then Isaiah said, 'Hear now, you house of David! Is it not enough to try the patience of humans? Will you try the patience of my God also?

Therefore the Lord himself will give you a sign: the virgin will conceive and give birth to a son, and you will call him Immanuel. He will be eating curds and honey when he knows enough to reject the wrong and choose the right, for before the boy knows enough to reject the wrong and choose the right, the land of the two kings you dread will be laid waste.

The Gospel Reading

Hear the Gospel of the Lord according to Matthew 1.18-25
Glory to Christ our Saviour.

This is how the birth of Jesus the Messiah came about:

His mother Mary was pledged to be married to Joseph, but before they came together, she was found to be pregnant through the Holy Spirit. Because Joseph her husband was faithful to the law, and did not want to expose her to public disgrace, he had in mind to divorce her quietly.

But after he had considered this, an angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream and said, 'Joseph son of David, do not be afraid to take Mary home as your wife, because what is conceived in her is from the Holy Spirit. She will give birth to a son, and you are to give him the name Jesus, because he will save his people from their sins.'

All this took place to fulfil what the Lord had said through the prophet: 'The virgin will conceive and give birth to a son, and they will call him Immanuel', which means 'God with us'.

When Joseph woke up, he did what the angel of the Lord had commanded him and took Mary home as his wife. But he did not consummate their marriage until after she gave birth to a son. And they gave him the name Jesus.

*Give thanks to the Lord for his glorious Gospel.
Praise to Christ our Lord.*

all honour and glory be to you,
Lord of all ages, world without end.

As an Eco Congregation we are all conscious about the cost of heating and the environmental impacts and desire to reduce our carbon footprint.

Over the last few years there has been an increasing concern about both churches and how we can continue to use them and heat them more effectively. Now with ever increasing energy bills and concern about the need to continue to reduce our carbon footprint we need to begin to seriously look at replacing our old heating systems.

The Heathack organisation is coming alongside Community Organisations like churches and is offering us the opportunity over Four group sessions to better understand our buildings usage, heating system and how to strategically think about the future.

It is hoped that these sessions working in partnership with a Volunteer Engineer will help us better understand the needs and usages of the buildings while gaining a greater knowledge about heating, ventilation, and energy efficiency. Alongside this we will also look at what is practical and possible before making recommendations to the Vestry of each church. In time we hope this will give us the knowledge and capacity to make good decisions about what we can do for the future to enhance the use of our buildings and keep them comfortably warm and usable.

At St Mary's, Val Cameron and Pauline Jones will be looking not only for a few members from the Vestry to be involved but are also looking for members of the congregation to join the Heathack Group and help us begin to take the next step towards understanding and developing a new way forward. 
