Who are the Blessed?

The rich appear to be getting richer with news of record breaking profits being made by energy companies while the poor are getting poorer.

It is disturbing to hear of billions being raised by some while the growing number of people seeking help from foodbanks at the same time is ever increasing. There is a great divide between the haves and have nots.

But are the rich, famous and powerful people of the world really blessed?

In our readings today from Psalm 1 and Luke's version of the Sermon on the Mount we read that Jesus declares that a number of unlikely people are in fact the blessed ones. He turns the notion of who is blessed and who is not upside down compared to the prominent world viewpoint.

Psalm 1 reveals that Blessed is the one who does not walk in step with the wicked but delights in God's law, the way of the Kingdom of God. We are to be discouraged from walking in the way of our earthly world that seeks fame and riches for selfish greed and gluttonous gain.

In contrast although it is never acceptable for people to be in abject poverty we are to remember that we are blessed when we know we are poor and in need of God, rather than relying solely on our own selfish efforts. We are blessed when we hunger, hunger for righteousness, truth and justice for it reminds us that we are to seek and know God's way.

In knowing our need for God and seeking God we will find that we are indeed the blessed ones. It may not be easy and there will be many challenges. Jesus never says it will be an easy life to be a follower of Jesus. He does however, encourage us to rejoice, to celebrate, when we face rejection and difficulty because we are living for Christ and not for ourselves. For in the fullness of time we will know the many blessings of a heavenly home.

So blessed are you when you turn to God, acknowledge your need of God, and walk in the ways of his Kingdom, learning form his word and putting his law of love into action.

In you and you in Me?


Lord, Your summons echoes true


