A journey to and beyond the Cross

'The time has come,' said Jesus.
'The kingdom of God has come near.
Repent and believe the good news!'
Mark 1 v15

The season of Lent as a time of preparation for the great feast and celebration of Easter has been observed since the early days of the Christians faith. By carefully keeping these days of Lent, we are encouraged to take to heart the gospel's call to repentance and the assurance of our forgiveness, and to grow and develop our faith and devotion to our Lord.

The Christian Church throughout the world calls on her members, in the name of Jesus, to the observance of a holy Lent, by self-examination and repentance; by prayer, fasting, and self-denial; and by reading, studying and meditating on God's holy word. In addition to this it is also encouraged that as well as self denial and the giving up of something for Lent that we could also take up active acts of love and kindness.

Lent begins by reminding us that we are all but dust and to dust we shall return. Yet even out of the dust, from the earth and dry bones of death Christ can bring forth new life, new hope. However, this new life comes through our own self examination of ourselves reminding ourselves that we are unworthy even to gather up the crumbs from under his table. Take time over these weeks to ask the Lord by the work of his Spirit in us to continue the work he has begun in us. To show us where we too need to repent and turn away from sin and turn to Christ once more.

Ultimately, if we are honest with ourselves we will get to a point where we will need to acknowledge that we like the Psalmist in Psalm 51 or the Tax Collector in the temple are sinners and that it is against God that we have trespassed and sinned. This confession helps us renew our relationship with God who although rightly condemns sin is also the one through Christ sacrificial work has mercy on us, forgives us our sins and sets us on the right path again to walk humbly with God into the future beyond the Cross.

Scottish Episcopal Church a journey Towards NetZero

The Climate emergency has not gone away and although the issue is complex and there are no easy fixes for our planet the Scottish Episcopal Church is calling on all its Dioceses and

churches to take steps to move towards a NetZero or Carbon free church by 2030. It may sound impossible but every step a Diocese, or Vestry can make to reduce their carbon footprint is a step in the right direction. Currently every SEC Church has been asked to submit an Energy footprint covering the carbon usage of each church building, hall and Rectory along with Diocesan and Provincial Offices. Alongside this consideration should also be taken by each church to take active action to reduce the use of fossil fuels and seek to engage in 100% Green Energy Tariffs for our energy supplies. As well as looking at our buildings we are also being asked to look at our work patterns, meetings and activities and how volunteers and employees such as the Rector can be equipped and encouraged to reduce their carbon footprint.

So what is happening locally with the churches of St Leonard's and St Mary's. In the last few years we have registered as Eco-congregations and organised a number of different events to raise the profile of the Climate Emergency.



We have had film and discussion evenings, litter picks and set up a monthly Swap Shop to encourage the reusing and recycling of a variety of goods rather than them going to land fill etc.

The challenge now for the Vestry and congregations is what more can be done? We now need to look at the future of our buildings and how to heat them as well as considering other aspects of the ministry of the church.

The Vestries acknowledge that we have an ethical, moral and scriptural obligation to seriously take on board changes that will be needed for each church to play its part. There will be a financial cost to bear but to do nothing is not an option and already the unseen cost from use of fossil fuels and the rise in pollutants is having an affect on our world today.

St Mary's especially with her old gas boiler (and I am not talking about the Rector) will need to seriously consider alternate heating solutions over the next five years. Currently their HeatHack Group is revealing some interesting results from monitoring how the church is used and recording evidence of how long it takes to heat the church and to allow the church to cool down. This will help us identify ways to minimise some of the usage of the boiler.

St Leonard's only uses Electricity and so would be encouraged along with St Mary's in the coming years to move over to 100% Green Energy Tariff. But alongside this St Leonard's is also concerned about the viability of the current heating system in the church and hall. The Heating group is looking at the possibility of air source heat pumps that could possibly be run on solar power but these discussions are in their early stages of being reviewed.



At our recent joint Vestry meeting both churches continued the discussion about what action could be taken together to continue to further reduce our carbon footprint by looking at the issue of the carbon footprint and pollutants produced by the Rector as he carries out his duties on behalf of the church. We noted with thanks

the generous donation that was given and invested in Solar Panels for the Rectory. This has helped reduce the shared energy costs and carbon output of the Rectory. To further benefit from the installation of the solar panels the proposal has been put to both Vestries to jointly lease an Electric Car for use of the Rector and ministry team. This in effect would remove around 800Kg of CO2 production compared to a small petrol engine vehicle and reduce other harmful pollutants like Nitric Oxide to zero. With the car having the ability to be charged from the Solar panels the subsequent running costs of the vehicle would further be reduced. Although it was noted that there would be an initial large financial layout for the lease deposit it was agreed by both Vestries that this was indeed a positive step forward on our journey to become a NetZero church.



St Leonard's Organ Fund

St Nicholas Seminary has been training clergy since 1975. It is the only active seminary in the Province of West Africa (which includes Ghana, Liberia, Sierra Leone, Guinea, the Gambia, and Cameroon). Alongside our own ordinands, we have also trained ministers and lay pastors for the Methodist and Pentecostal Churches in Ghana and Ivory Coast.

To assist them to continue this work they are seeking to install a water filtration plant at the College to give clean water not only to the seminary but also to other community buildings like the schools, university and the general public.
