Gospel Reading John 4 v4-26

Hear the Gospel of our Lord according to John Glory to Christ our Saviour.

On his way through Samaria Jesus and his disciples came to a town called Sychar, near the plot of ground Jacob had given to his son Joseph. Jacob's well was there, and Jesus, tired as he was from the journey, sat down by the well. It was about noon.

When a Samaritan woman came to draw water, Jesus said to her, 'Will you give me a drink?' (His disciples had left him and gone into the town to buy food.) The woman said to him, 'You are a Jew and I am a Samaritan woman. How can you ask me for a drink?' (For Jews do not associate with Samaritans.) Jesus answered her, 'If you knew the gift of God and who it is that asks you for a drink, you would have asked him and he would have given you living water.' 'Sir,' the woman said, 'you have nothing to draw with and the well is deep. Where can you get this living water? Are you greater than our father Jacob, who gave us the well and drank from it himself, as did also his sons and his livestock?'

Jesus answered, 'Everyone who drinks this water will be thirsty again, but whoever drinks the water I give them will never thirst. Indeed, the water I give them will become in them a spring of water welling up to eternal life.' The woman said to him, 'Sir, give me this water so that I won't get thirsty and have to keep coming here to draw water.' He told her, 'Go, call your husband and come back.' 'I have no husband,' she replied. Jesus said to her, 'You are right when you say you have no husband. The fact is, you have had five husbands, and the man you now have is not your husband. What you have just said is quite true.'

'Sir,' the woman said, 'I can see that you are a prophet. 2Our ancestors worshipped on this mountain, but you Jews claim that the place where we must worship is in Jerusalem.' 'Woman,' Jesus replied, 'believe me, a time is coming when you will worship the Father neither on this mountain nor in Jerusalem. As Samaritans you worship what you do not know; we worship what we do know, for salvation is from the Jews. Yet a time is coming and has now come when the true worshippers will worship the Father in the Spirit and in truth, for they are the kind of worshippers the Father seeks. God is spirit, and his worshippers must worship in the Spirit and in truth.' The woman said, 'I know that Messiah' (called Christ) 'is coming. When he comes, he will explain everything to us.'

Then Jesus declared, 'I, the one speaking to you – I am he.'

Give thanks to the Lord for his glorious Gospel. **Praise to Christ our Lord.**

Take my voice, and let me sing Always, only, for my King; Take my lips, and let them be Filled with messages from Thee.



<u>The Link Book Club</u>




Our latest venture was a Novel *The call of the Cormorant* by Donald S. Murray. Based on the true-life story of one called Karl Einarsson. As a child of the late 19th century in the wind-swept fog bound Faroe Islands, Karl Einarsson grows up believing he is superior to his peers, destined for a life of art and adventure.

As soon as he is old enough he sets out for Denmark and begins his own reinvention. Once untethered from his past Karl's lies begin

to spiral. He begins a life of serial scamming, swindling everyone from fishermen to aristocrats. But when his schemes find him in 1930's Berlin, he is forced to reckon with something much bigger than himself. As the Nazis rise to power around him his indifference becomes unwitting compliance and even betrayal.

We had mixed feelings about the novel although it was a good read we found that the main character was a very unlikeable character for reasons above. The chapters kept leaping back to his family at home in the Faroes. At the end of the book it was left open was Karl imprisoned for his collaboration or not?
