Ukrainian Fund Update



Due to the generosity and love of many members of our congregations we have been able to help support four different Ukrainian families in various ways over this past year.

The Raichevs our original sponsored family are now settled in Dalkeith with the children beginning their next year at school. Alla and her family have recently moved into a house

in Gorebridge, while Katya our new pianist at St Leonard's has moved in to a house with her daughter and grandson in Loanhead. Then Nadia who was staying with Alison Bruce is now living with her daughter Yana (who was living with Pauline Jones and have moved to accommodation in Woodburn.

The opportunity to support these individuals and their families has been a blessing both to those who have fled the war but also to us as churches living out Jesus call for us to love our neighbours. We give thanks to God for all who helped make this possible with financial gifts or gifts of items, friendship and support. Once again the families thank you for your kindness and generosity and for how we have helped make them feel welcomed and loved in their new home with us in Scotland. We continue to pray for them and for an end to the war.

As the families now move on to becoming more self reliant we feel the time has come to close the Ukrainian Fund. So if you have been in the habit of making donations to this fund please feel free to stop or consider supporting other work like Christian Aid. Of course none of us knows the future but for now we feel we can congratulate ourselves and give thanks for a job well done.

There is approximately £3000 still in the fund and this will in part be distributed to each family as a gift for them to purchase items that they have asked for if funds allow. As well as these final gifts we plan also to hold onto half the money and for this to be kept in reserve to allow us to offer additional support to help cover heating and lighting costs over the winter months. Any final surplus will then be gifted on to the families.
