Hear us, most merciful Father, and send your Holy Spirit on us and on this bread and this wine; that they may be the Body and Blood of Christ, and that, sharing your life, we may travel in your company to our journey's end.

With all your people we give you thanks and praise through the Son and in the Spirit, now and for ever. Amen.





Annie Naish, Mercy Ships

Annie lives and serves on board the African Mercy hospital ship and is chaplain to a sizeable crew of specialist medics and volunteers who perform life changing surgeries. As well as Chaplain Annie is also leader of the scuba diving team regularly working under the ship to keep the water intakes (for cooling generators, etc.) clear of rubbish and marine-life. Currently the African Mercy is undergoing a refurb in Durban.

Annie writes: "It really is like living in a building site, with many demanding conditions. As well as all these physical

challenges everyone on board is working really hard. Although the actual refit is being done by the shipyard and other outside contractors, the AFM crew have a crucial role in supporting, enabling, facilitating this project work, whilst also doing our own vital renovations.

. It has been a real privilege to be the sole chaplain on board. Seeing how God is at work bringing hope and healing and changing lives even amongst the daily noise, dust and chaos is always so exciting. I am very proud of being part of the dedicated, committed, elite "AFM Durban 2023" crew and will look back on this as one of the most extraordinary experiences of my life. Please pray for Annie as she explores her future ministry and pray for the work of Mercy Ships in its global outreach to bring good news and health care to many in need..
