#### Reading: St Francis and his call to repair God's church

As a young man Francis Bernardone (known nowadays as St Francis of Assisi) had a strong urge to know what God wanted him to do with his life.

He stumbled into a tumbled down church and knelt and prayed.

Whilst looking at the crucifix he heard God speaking to him, "Francis, rebuild my church".

He took it to mean rebuild the building he was in.
He began by collecting stones to do this.
But he had mis-understood
God wanted him to renew and rebuild
the faith of the people in order to rebuild his Church.

As we come to this time of reimagining with the image of the vine and its' fruit, and listening to God's word for our churches, how does St Francis' experience speak to ours? (Pause)

Let us hear again the reading from John chapter 15:

Jesus said
"I am the vine; you are the branches.
If you remain in me and I in you,
you will bear much fruit;
apart from me you can do nothing."

#### Table activity part 1:

Spend time looking at the long list produced from our previous visioning exercise - these are the ROOTS of the tree.

Then spend 2 minutes individually identifying from the list 5 things we are now doing.

Spend another 2 minutes working together to choose five you think are most important or speak to you the most.

We thank you for the first fruits of our visioning process, for all the new activities that have begun in your name.

We ask that you will help us to develop more good fruit that will feed our local communities and spread your good news far and wide. We offer you these new ideas - fruit of the future.

God of creativity and growth: we offer ourselves to you.

Loving God, we bring you our hopes and dreams, and ask that you will continue to bring forth good fruit that build your church in our community. in the name of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ.


#### **Sending Out**
