ADVENT 3 JOY

I hope we all know what it feels like to be joyful. It is an experience of being happy, cheerful, or more importantly having a positive outlook on life.

A spiritual joy is not about doing things or having things that make you happy for a short time. Our emotions can rise and fall throughout the day and cannot fully be trusted. A spiritual joy however, is about having an understanding and acceptance of what God has done for us, is doing for us and will do for us. In fact it was often in times of trouble and darkness when God's people were feeling lost and concerned that God's prophets encouraged the people to rejoice in the Lord, to trust in his promises and know the joy of His salvation. So although we may face uncertain days we can face the future knowing that God is faithful. The promised Messiah arrived in the babe of Bethlehem and just as this promise was fulfilled so to are the promises that in our Father's house there is a place for us and one day Christ will return. We can take joy in this mystery of faith that Christ has died, Christ is risen, Christ will come again.

Glory and thanksgiving be to you, most loving Father. In Jesus you showed us yourself.

After supper, he took the cup, he offered you thanks and gave it to them, saying:

"Drink this, all of you. This is my Blood of the new covenant; it is poured out for you, and for all, that sins may be forgiven. Do this in remembrance of me."

We now obey your Son's command. We recall his blessed passion and death, his glorious resurrection and ascension; and we look for the coming of his Kingdom. Made one with him, we offer you these gifts and with them ourselves, a single, holy, living sacrifice. Hear us, most merciful Father, and send your Holy Spirit upon us and upon this bread and this wine, that, overshadowed by his life-giving power, they may be the Body and Blood of your Son, and we may be kindled with the fire of your love and renewed for the service of your Kingdom.

Help us, who are baptised into the fellowship of Christ's Body to live and work to your praise and glory; may we grow together in unity and love until at last, in your new creation, we enter into our heritage in the company of the Virgin Mary, the apostles and prophets, and of all our brothers and sisters living and departed.

Through Jesus Christ our Lord, with whom, and in whom, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all honour and glory be to you, Lord of all ages, world without end. **Amen.**
